International experiences of business models for DH	
12:45 – 13:45	Speaker: Caren Herbstritt, Scientific Advisor for environment, nature conservation and climate change, Hamburg Parliamentary Green Party. <i>Changing ownership and governance of district heating in Hamburg</i> The municipality in Hamburg undertook a form of re-municipalisation of the local district heating network in 2012, taking on a 25.1% share in the network which was previously 100% owned by Vattenfall. This presentation will explore how and why this change in ownership took place.
	Speaker: Birger Laurensen, International Manager, Danish District Heating Association <i>International approaches to working with industrial heat sources – examples from Denmark and more</i> This presentation will cover the different ways that Danish local authorities have enabled use of excess heat within district heating systems. It will explore how the Danish not-for-profit rules for heat sales have influenced how relationships with excess heat providers have been established, and how this context has supported or hindered the process.
